II POPULATION - U.S. CENSUS, 1950

A-1 For the decade 1940 to 1950, Somerville's population increased by 174 or 0.2%. Since the excess of births over deaths for this decade was 9,650, there was a net out-migration of 9,476. The 1953 birth rate in Somerville was 22.5 persons per thousand of the population while the death rate for the same year was 10.4 persons per thousand. As of April 1, 1950, there were 22,985 married couples living in Somerville, of which 21,270 had their own household.
